

#### Access to Care – Action Items

- ❖ Develop a General Surgery Program at BCH
- Increase accessibility to Specialists at BCH
- Develop the telemedicine program to also include all clinic locations
- ❖ Promote specialty services so community is aware of what's available at BCH
- ❖ Recruitment of Nurse Practitioner and Primary Care Physician in 2019
- ❖ Explore Increasing Walkin Clinic accessibility
- Continue to develop the Chronic Care Management program
- Explore Home Health Providers



# Nutrition, Physical Activity, Weight Management – Action Items

- ❖ The Bath Community Rehab & Wellness Center will continue to offer programs for all ages.
- Lunch and learn and Monday dinner education series will be offered in the cafeteria with our local providers as well as specialty providers presenting on various topics as indicated as focus areas from the CHNA.
- ❖ The Bath Community Hospital will offer education programs for the community on healthy eating and good nutrition and education on staying fit.
- **Research** the development of a health library for the hospital website.
- ❖ Contact large employers/groups in the community to schedule dates & locations of education events that are FREE and open to the community.
- Offer healthy tips/education segments on local radio stations



# Substance Abuse – Drugs, Alcohol, Tobacco & Access to care – Action Items

- ❖ Implement care coordination practices to organize patient care activities
- Educate community members on opioid use disorder, treatment options and methods for preparing and referring individuals to treatment
- ❖ Develop annual drug take back days and drop boxes at the hospital
- Continue the development of the addiction coalition with VDH
- **❖** Explore Suboxone Clinic requirements and BCH capacity
- Develop support groups for various addiction treatments
- Continue partnership with local church program
